## Delta Epsilon Kappa Alumni to Reunite at National American University

RAPID CITY, SOUTH DAKOTA – National American University (NAU) will welcome more the 60 members of the fraternity, Delta Epsilon Kappa (DEK), who will reunite at NAU's Rapid City campus at 5301 Mt. Rushmore Road at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 15, 2018. Fraternity members who attended the university during the 1970s and 1980s, and their spouses, will be traveling from around the country.

The reunion will feature a video tribute to NAU's 76-year history, campus tours, and a tribute to the legacy of Guy Tillett, who was dedicated to serving students and alumni of NAU for nearly 50 years prior to his passing early this year.

"Mr. Tillett was helpful in the development of our fraternity and so supportive to all students," said Paul Bormann, who attended National College of Business, as the university was called then, in the mid-1970s. "Several our fraternity members from the Rapid City area stayed in touch with Mr. Tillett in the years following graduation."

The university's Delta Epsilon Kappa chapter was founded in 1971 with the motto "DEK is brotherhood, brotherhood is DEK."

In addition to their visit to National American University, reunion participants plan to take in some of the sights in Rapid City and the Black Hills.

"Mostly, we want to reconnect with each other," said Paul, who is helping to coordinate the event. "Many of us have stayed in touch over the years but some of the guys we have not seen since college. We are all looking forward to seeing one another again and sharing memories from our time at the college. Those were good years."
