In 2017, she was determined to complete her education, even though life remained challenging. She was caring for her two young great nephews and experienced some health challenges, but she is on track to graduate.

"For 35 years I have looked after other people, taken care of other people, put their needs before mine, and I finally decided that I am important and valuable and I deserve to accomplish my goal for me."
